FAR NORTH QUEENSLAND FLOODS A message from the Bishop of the Lutheran Church of Queensland, Rev Dr Mark Vainikka

Many in Far North Queensland face an uncertain future in the aftermath of ex tropical cyclone Jasper in all its devastation. While many in and around Cairns have lost everything, the small town of Wujal Wujal has suffered the most. Pastor Mark Winter reports that, unfortunately, our church building there has been flooded. Having visited Wujal Wujal, it's difficult to imagine the waters rising that high. In addition to the Lutheran church in the centre of town, the town's police station, medical clinic and about 30 homes are underwater. People are wanting to get out. There's no power, no sewerage, no food. Some people have lost everything. Over a century of flood-records were broken in rivers just outside Cairns and the Daintree.

As always, our response as a church is twofold. Firstly, our primary response is prayer. We commit ourselves, our loved ones and our communities to the Lord, knowing that amidst the devastation experienced, God journeys with us. We pray individually and we pray corporately. We pray prayers based on Scripture and we allow God's Word to guide our prayers. And we pray the words that are formed from the deepest places of our souls, as we cry out to God for help. As Dietrich Bonhoeffer reminds us, 'A Christian fellowship lives and exists by the intercession of its members for one another, or it collapses' *(Life Together, p.65).*

Secondly, we act. We respond in generosity and concern towards those who are in need. As a church in Queensland and northern New South Wales, we have responded with generosity again and again over the years. Dealing with storms and floods is part of living in Queensland and northern New South Wales, but it's part of life especially in tropical Far North Queensland. We have given generously of our finances and of our time in support of relief efforts. And in turn, we have been the recipients of the generosity of our church members from throughout Australia and New Zealand. I am sure, this time will be no different.

Currently, work is underway to provide a way for people to give directly to those who are most in need. The details will be communicated with you as soon as that work has been completed.
